## THE TERRITORY AHEAD

This is the first of the monthly updates we will be including in our Church Family Newsletter, in regards to the process of bringing on a new pastor. Unlike some denominations that simply "appoint" a new pastor for churches-in-need, in the Presbyterian Church (and our specific denomination the E.P.C.) a more democratic process is employed where we conduct a "search" -- much like a corporation would do.

Simply put, our Church-Family and your Church-Session-Elders are embarking on a three-phase journey as follows:

**First** - we temporarily need to line up speakers to present the sermon during each Sunday morning service. In addition to utilizing our own Elders (and other qualified local folks) we have been in communication with the Midwest Presbytery - Ministerial Committee to enlist their help. Our first approach will be to work with Gateway Presbyterian Church Findlay OH and tie into their "streaming" sermons on a fairly regular basis (which we would show on our two video screens) -- and -- also enlist our church's elders and other local folks, as needed.

**Second** - we have been in contact with both the Midwest Presbytery and the Nationwide EPC; and they both confirm what we already knew, that permanent pastoral candidates are in short supply. So in the near term, our "best bet" and the mutual goal with both these organizations is to locate what's termed a Transitional Pastor who would basically fill the role of our very own pastor, but only on a 12-month basis (with extensions possible in 2-3 month increments). This person would not be eligible to become our permanent pastor - because they have been specifically trained to help churches through interim times only.

**Third** - after those first two steps are rolling smoothly we would convene our own Pastor Nominating Committee -- with the goal of "advertising our vacancy" and going through the process of reviewing (and eventually choosing) a candidate as our Permanent Pastor.

That's why I've chosen the title of THE TERRITORY AHEAD for these monthly newsletter updates. The overall process will take time and much patience. As always, if you have any comments or questions we strongly encourage you to reach out to either myself or any of our current Session Members.


